Gifts From God: by Amy Serrano Updates on Our True Heroes

Last month I brought you up to date on some of the children featured in previous newsletters. This month I want to introduce you to someone new. She is a wonderful young lady who has been at the village for about six months. Her name is Brenda. She is 14 years old and has a very sobering story to tell.

Brenda was born in Progresso just outside of San Pedro Sula. Her mom was a single mother that loved to party and did little to care for Brenda. When Brenda was nine, her mother sent her to live with her grandmother. This is when Brenda's life took a terrible turn for the worse.

Brenda's grandmother was a hard, cold woman. She subjected Brenda to very hard work in the home. Worst of all, her uncle (her mother's brother) began violently abusing her sexually from the first day she came to live in her grandmother's house.

Brenda was trapped in a nightmare. When she cried to her grandmother, who knew full well what was going on, she told Brenda, "Well you are such a tramp, you ask for it!" Brenda's uncle was a very violent and angry man who hit everyone in the house, including his own mother.

Brenda and her little brother, then seven years old, ran away. She said they didn't know where they where going; they just took off into the jungle. After they were found, Brenda watched as her uncle beat her brother ruthlessly, leaving him inches from death. Brenda lost all hope.

When she turned 12, her grandmother laughingly told her that she would eventually get pregnant by her uncle and then he would kill her. Brenda went to an aunt, told her what was going on, and asked how to commit suicide. Her aunt told her



not to think about it. Her aunt invited Brenda to go to Puerto Cortes to do some shopping with her the next day. Brenda's uncle never let her out of the house, but Brenda's aunt said it would be safe to go.

At the bus stop, Brenda's aunt said, "You get on first." Her aunt talked to the bus driver, but she did not get on the bus. The bus pulled away.

Frightened and alone, Brenda sat and cried. The driver stopped in front of a store in Puerto Cortes. Waiting out in front were some of Brenda's paternal relatives: her grandmother, an uncle and one of her older brothers. Her aunt had arranged for these other relatives to rescue her. But her aunt had to do it in secret, for fear of what her brother, Brenda's uncle, might do.

Brenda said her dad's family treated her well. They were very poor, and she had to sleep in the bed with her grandparents. She began to wonder about her mom. Where was she? Why

didn't she want her? She was safe but very depressed. She could not eat or sleep and cried most nights.

About a month later, her mother showed up with the police, claiming that Brenda had been kidnapped. The aunt who had rescued Brenda told her she had to tell the police about the abuse she suffered in her other grandmother's house. Brenda was afraid to tell the police and get sent back to the abusive grandmother and uncle anyway. She was sure her mother's brother would kill her. Her dad's brother told her that he would report the abusive uncle if she didn't.

Brenda went with her dad's brother to the District Attorney's office. To Brenda's surprise, the D.A. (a very good friend of this ministry) believed every word, and her mom's brother was sent to prison that day. They also told her that she should go somewhere else because it was not safe to stay where she was. Brenda's torment ended when they called and asked us to take her.

Brenda's mother called recently, desperate to talk to her. She asked Oscar to send her to San Pedro Sula, but he told her she was out of her mind and hung up the phone. Oscar reported this conversation to the D.A. Her mother had also called the D.A. trying to get to Brenda. He said her mother wanted Brenda to take back the story

of her uncle's abuse, and sign papers to get him out of jail. The D.A. assured us that her mother no longer had any rights to Brenda.

Brenda is now in the third grade and doing very well. She enjoys some of the more innocent things in life. She collects and plays with Barbies. She is making lots of friends and is well liked

by the other girls at the Village.

After hearing Brenda's story, I can't help but cry out, "Lord, if we had only been there sooner!" It reminds me of the story of Lazarus. God allowed Brenda to "die", in a sense, as He has so many of these children. Out of all of this hopelessness, one beam of light is this: It was for God's own glory that He allowed Lazarus to die, because the miracle of restoring life would be so much greater.

My bible reading today was about the story of the blind man that had his sight restored in John 9. Jesus's disciples asked him whose sin had caused the man to be born blind. Jesus replied that it was not because of anyone's sin, but for God's glory.

So, why has God allowed Brenda or any of these kids to go through these horrible things? If God is able to take a life as badly damaged as Brenda's and restore it, how many



might see and want to know this same God! If Brenda rises from the ashes and takes the comfort she has received from God to comfort others who are going down the same road (2 Corinthians 1:3-5), then tragedy will turn to triumph. That is my hope and solace in all

of these stories that we share with you each month.

We are blessed to be a part of the amazing story that is being written right now in the lives of these children. God allowed them to suffer injustices and one day some of them will make history. As I stand among these children, I look forward to seeing just how beautiful their lives will become and just how the Lord will use them. As I work and play with them, I get goose bumps thinking that I may be standing in the midst of greatness.

In order to become what God is making them, their basic needs must be met. Our mission is to provide these basic needs. The ministry grows each day. I am so thankful for everyone that supports this ministry. If you are not already doing so, please prayerfully consider helping us with this profound and important work in Jesus's name. There are many more Brendas just waiting to be rescued. - AS

A local physician from Puerto Cortes, Dr. Nelly Hernandez, has decided to help with the children's medical needs. She comes every other Sunday to do check-ups and she sees our children for free when we have to bring them into her office. Dr. Hernandez is now also in charge of arranging the clinics for our medical groups. We praise God for sending her kindred spirit our way.

The children are all doing well in school. Another child becomes an adult as Josué turns 18 on the May 29th. He will play for the National Soccer League when the season starts again in June. All of the children are

progressing in their English, as Maria is teaching them.

Recently, two judges from IHNFA, the child protection agency of Honduras, came to visit Children's Village. They had never been before, but had heard many good reports.

Many orphanages here are only "warehouses" for children. They told

us that our Children's Village was the best run orphanage that they had ever seen! Now, I don't say this to our glory, I say it to yours. They were so impressed that the children had medical care, went to school, and had good food to eat. They could see the children are healthy and go to school. They inspected the lunch we served



There have been questions regarding the transportation needs of the Children's Village in Honduras. Why send a

used school bus, and what happened with the vans? Well, the vans are reaching the end of their useful lives. Though well cared for, they have been used a great deal and the rough roads and countless miles have taken their toll. They have mechanical issues that are very costly to repair and a bus will be able to transport more people with fewer trips.

Teams of construction workers, medical and dental groups, and missionaries need transportation to and from the airport and within the country. At great expense, buses are hired to transport people from

outlying communities to the Village for treatment during clinics. The benefit far outweighs the expense as these people do not have private transportation and need treatment. Medical and dental teams also travel to other communities to help the people in those villages. The children at the Village need to go to the city for church and other outings. Bus transportation is widely used in Honduras. Support services for repair and maintenance are available. To transport large numbers, bus transportation is by far the most cost efficient method available.
